         but it's still a challenge to get courses
      - Working towards having internal MED facilitators to reduce the barrier to getting MED courses for our members
      - FBC launched learning facilitator training
        - Nominated 5 coaches
      - Safe Contact is now expiring after 5 years. Safe
         Contact 2.0 is available online now for a \$10 course
  - Hired Technical Director
    - JD posted and had 4 applications Jordan was the best fit
    - Coaching certification will be transitioning to Jordan
  - Working on Regional Academies & Team BC with Cory
  - BC is the only PSO that doesn't have HS under their umbrella
